That's the message behind the Father's Day White Ribbon Campaign, an effort by Longmont Ending Violence Initiative to fight the problem of domestic violence in Longmont.

The campaign kicks off today. Its organizers ask that men in our community

reach out to boys, teens and men to raise awareness about domestic violence, which leaves more Longmont residents injured each year than any other crime.

Organizers ask that as a sign of their support for this effort, men and boys in our community wear white ribbons.

Domestic violence is a crime committed disproportionately by men. It is men who must stand up to stop it.

So for the next two weeks, we ask that the men of this community take a stand. Speak to those who respect you. Encourage them to treat women with respect, to avoid violence, and to seek avenues of bonding that lead them to becoming positive role models.

And wear your white ribbons. Make the whole community aware where you stand on this issue.
